



Big Brothers Big Sisters of North and West Niagara in partnership with Big Brothers Big Sisters of South Central Niagara announce intent to amalgamate to form one Niagara agency.

Big Brothers Big Sisters of North and West Niagara (BBBSNWN) and Big Brothers Big Sisters of South Central Niagara (BBBSSCN) have announced their intent to amalgamate into a single agency, creating the largest mentoring program to support children and youth across Niagara.

The new agency will operate under the name Big Brothers Big Sisters of Niagara (BBBSN). "Our goal is to create a single, strong Big Brothers Big Sisters that will increase our impact throughout the entire Niagara region," says Frank Ruberto, Board Chair for BBBSSCN. "We want to ensure that every child that wants a mentor has access to a mentor."

The amalgamation will allow BBBSN to enhance and expand programs and services across the Niagara region, leveraging best practices from both agencies, and ultimately provide consistent support for vulnerable children and youth. "The ongoing support and strengths of our two agencies, staff, volunteers, donors and stakeholders will contribute to the success of this natural evolution for Big Brothers Big Sisters of Niagara," says Erin Graybiel, Executive Director for BBBSNWN.

The amalgamated agency will maintain the size of its collective workforce, services and locations. Over the coming months the agencies will combine fundraising efforts, services, staff teams and administrative functions. BBBSN staff structure will consider community needs, agency priorities and staff skill sets. "Joining forces is an incredible opportunity to strengthen our mission, combine resources, and maximize our impact in the community," says Sarah Ludberg, Executive Director for BBBSSCN.

The agencies believe the amalgamation will enhance their fundraising capability across the region. "We've already begun to work collaboratively with joint fund raising initiatives like Project Snowflake," says Gynette Smith, Board Chair for BBBSNWN. "One Niagara agency allows us to strengthen existing relationships with donors and partners, while also seeking out new partnerships that help us support more children, volunteers and families."

The amalgamation is expected to be completed by the summer of 2023.
