

Testimonials & Match Highlights

"During a match check in with one of my in-school matches recently, I learned from Tracy, the mentor, that her mentee, Mayce, had transitioned to Mason and was now using he/him pronouns. Tracy then went on to explain that she has noticed that Mason seems more confident with himself, and told me about the ways that she has helped Mason with his transition.

Tracy told me that Mason's mom wasn't on board with the transition at first, and this had been a point of stress for Mason. Tracy has been encouraging him to continue to talk to his mom about it, and reassuring him that it will take time but that he should keep trying. Tracy said that Mason's mom has since allowed Mason to cut his hair short and dye it, which Tracy sees as a positive step.

Mason shared that Tracy has given him a lot of good advice, and that they have a good mutual respect built up. For a grade 8 student to not only recognize but also verbalize this to a program worker, shows me that Mason has that maturity and awareness that Tracy was talking about. During the check in, I was able to confirm Mason's pronouns and congratulate him on his transition, which was a really cool experience for me personally (and one I have been able to repeat!).

Tracy said she got involved to help a child out, and she feels that she has been able to do this with Mason. Tracy said it gave her a lot of satisfaction to know that Mason was comfortable enough to talk to her about his transition and how he feels. This kind of support is the epitome of what our programs represent; where would he be without Tracy?

Although this is a great example of the support our In-School programs provide, it is by no means a unique one. I have had several mentees transition this year, some with the support of their families, some without. Personally, I don't think it can be overstated how important it is for kids who transition to have positive adults to support them, whether it is school staff, parents, or mentors.

The experiences I have had with these kids has really re-affirmed the need for our programs to be inclusive, and the importance of ally-ship, recognizing pronouns and allowing these kids to be their true selves. This support matters to these kids, and our mentors can make all the difference in the world to them."



Executive Director's Message

2022 was a monumental year of recovery and rebuilding for BBBS of North and West Niagara. Our incredible staff team continued to adapt, while maintaining life-changing programs and services for children and youth in our community. Our Staff team may be small in size, but the volume of support, training and resources they offer our incredible volunteers, children, youth, families, and partners is enormous. As we shifted back to in-person programs and services, it quickly became evident how integral in-person connections are for the formation and continuation of developmental relationships.

The Staff and Board worked together to identify three strategic priorities that guided our efforts.

- · Position the agency for continued growth and impact
- \cdot Embrace new and innovative ways of operating
- · Enhance internal and external engagement

These priorities not only led to the strengthening of our agency, but also the monumental decision to begin to amalgamate with Big Brothers Big Sisters of South Central Niagara. This amalgamation work continues, and sets the stage for Big Brothers Big Sisters to provide life-changing programs and services to children and youth in our community for future generations.

In 2022, our Staff team worked relentlessly to recruit new volunteers as the demand for mentors continued to rise. A significant number of community members came forward to be volunteer mentors for our Community Based, In School and Group mentoring programs. Volunteer recruitment and retention efforts continue, as we know mentorship is a tangible way we can equip children and youth to overcome many of the challenges they are facing.

As the needs of families in our community continued to rise, Big Brothers Big Sisters responded by adding a Family Intake and Support Coordinator to our staff compliment to offer families additional supports, community referrals and resources. Collaborations with other social service agencies allowed Big Brothers Big Sisters to offer families wrap-around supports, while maintaining our focus on mentoring.

Thanks to incredible community support, our Holiday Hampers and School Readiness programs were expanded to support more children, youth and families at critical times of the year. These programs ensure children and youth had what they needed for the start of school and to celebrate the holiday season.

As we worked to recover, support from existing and new donors was integral to strengthening our financial position. We were very fortunate to receive a significant gift from Greg and Diane Slight, a five-year commitment from The Joyce Family Foundation, and continue support from a numerous granters and donors.
