

In July 2022, Big Brothers Big Sisters of South Niagara and Big Brothers Big Sisters of Niagara Falls came together to form the South Central Niagara agency. An incredible amount of work from the Staff and Board went into making this amalgamation happen, while ensuring programs, services, and fundraising efforts continued.

This first amalgamation strengthened of our agency and positioned it for further unification. In the fall of 2022, the decision was made to begin to amalgamate with Big Brothers Big Sisters of North and West Niagara. 2022 was a year of growth, accomplishment and change.

On July 8th, 2022, we officially completed the legal amalgamation of Big Brothers Big Sisters of Niagara Falls and Big Brothers Big Sisters of South Niagara to officially become Big Brothers Big Sisters of South Central Niagara. On August 30th, we welcomed many of our friends and closest supporters to join us for a ribbon cutting ceremony and celebration for all that had been achieved in bringing these two agencies together to provide mentoring services and supports for the communities of Niagara Falls, Fort Erie, Port Colborne, Welland, Pelham and Wainfleet. It took the tremendous support of our staff team and dedicated Board of Directors to bring this to reality, and I am so very proud of everyone for their efforts.

Throughout 2022, as the COVID pandemic finally started to ease, we celebrated the return of many of our signature fundraising and match events to their in-person format. A sold-out Golf For Kids Sake at Lookout Point Golf and Country Club, a summer picnic at Memorial Park in Welland, and a holiday party at Cataract Bowl in Niagara Falls were just some of the highlights. We also tried some new fundraising events, such as our first ever Nearly New Thrift Store Garage Sale at Knights of Columbus Hall in Niagara Falls and a Silent Auction at Seaway Mall Welland.

Our Nearly New Store Thrift Store had an amazing year, not only recovering from the extended COVID closures of the previous couple of years, but even achieving a few months of record sales! The store runs almost exclusively by volunteers and the proceeds are directed right back to our mentoring programs! In addition, we are proud to serve both locals and newcomers in need of essential items through a new voucher program and partnership we have embarked on with the Salvation Army.

As the year came to a close, our Board of Directors publicly announced that we would be embarking on another amalgamation journey, this time amalgamating with our friends at Big Brothers Big Sisters of North and West Niagara. With this final Niagara amalgamation, there will be one unified BBBS agency to serve the region. And with the Big Brothers Big Sisters of Niagara unification already well underway, 2023 promises to be just as exciting, challenging and eventful as 2022 was. Thank-you to the amazing staff, board of directors, volunteers, families, donors, funders, partners and many more in our community who make Big Brothers Big Sisters possible. 
